In Memory of Bishop Yanta


August 6th will be the first anniversary of the death of the visionary founder of the Polish Heritage Center, Bishop John Walter Yanta. Bishop Yanta's life showcased the spiritual and priestly talents of a well-formed faith, an ability to empathize with others, a willingness to go the extra mile and a strong prayer life. It also highlighted his business and institutional skills of management, leadership, and vision. Bishop's life abounded with friendships, challenges, loss of loved ones and countless masses, daily prayers, confessions, baptisms, marriages, funerals, and retreats.

Bishop Yanta firmly believed in the power of the Holy Spirit and in always being prepared for future needs. He began every project with research, talking to others, assembling a team, and encouraging consistent follow-up. He began each meeting with a prayer for guidance. And he was never shy about taking a stand.

Following a storied career spanning more than five decades, serving as priest, auxiliary bishop in San Antonio and Bishop of Amarillo, Bishop Yanta retired on January 3, 2008, moving back to San Antonio to be near his family roots in Runge and the friends of all ethnic backgrounds that he developed in this region. He also envisioned and began work on the crowning achievement of his last decade: the Polish Heritage Center at Panna Maria.

Bishop Yanta faced a life-threatening illness in December 2016 which had him out of commission for eight months, but he rebounded. It was inspirational to see him, despite his Trachea, learn to communicate first through an alphabet pad, then with a speaking device. He exercised daily, both spiritually and physically.

Bishop Yanta continued to work while in the hospital and rehab facility, meeting with the architect, designer and his Board. And he continued that work through the final years, despite several trips to the emergency room and short hospital stays.

He chaired a weekly meeting with his "kitchen cabinet" and was actively involved in all aspects of the Polish Heritage Center. He loved coming to Panna Maria to see the progress and was able to take an active role in the Blessing and subsequent Grand Opening of the Polish Heritage Center in October of 2021, the month he turned 90 years old.

Bishop Yanta made friends wherever he went. He really cared for others and was interested in your family, your views, and your faith. His personal relationships included people from every walk of life, from every culture and from every generation.

His life should be an inspiration to each of us and a challenge to expand our daily prayer life, including the Blessed Mother's Rosary. As Bishop Yanta said: "Prayer is the most powerful force on Earth." He wants us to take God's gifts of time, talent and treasure and share them with others. This was Bishop Yanta's way of life, and he was able to engage each of us in a friendship and love that was a testament to his faith. His reliance on the Holy Spirit guided him throughout his life.

You can feel Bishop Yanta's presence in the Polish Heritage Center in the exhibits, the movies, the recognitions of the 13 original communities and the families who immigrated from the region of Upper Silesia, now a part of Poland, in the mid to late 19th century. We invite each of you to come and visit his vision and legacy.

Bishop Yanta honored those original immigrants who survived tremendous hardship for their faith, their families, and their communities. We honor our Bishop by honoring our immigrant ancestors in this special edition of the newsletter.





News from the Heritage Communities

Happy 125th, St. Ann's Church, Kosciuszko

Celebrating its 125th anniversary, St. Ann's Catholic Church and parish will host their annual picnic on August 6. Great BBQ (dine in and drive thru), raffle, and memorabilia featuring anniversary cookbooks and ornaments headline this event.

A bit of history: In search of land, about 65 Polish families moved north from Czestochowa along the Cibolo, settling in an area called Little Egypt near already-established farms and ranches. By 1880, the community would be called Kosciuszko, the first Polish colony in Wilson County.

Kosciuszko remained a mission of Czestochowa until the 1890s. In 1892, a Polish Catholic school, named St. Ann's, was built, joined in a few years by a second school a few miles away. By 1896, the village boasted a general store and post office. The first St. Ann's Church was built in 1898 for \$2000 and community labor. It was dedicated on October 27, 1898.
